



Schedule for Success

The University of Arizona is here to help you plan a schedule built for success in the first semester. This fall your schedule will be limited to no more than 14 units, and will include coursework that allows you to build a solid academic foundation for your collegiate career.

Placement results play a part in shaping your first semester. Your score on the UA Math Placement (ALEKS) test has placed you into the following two courses:

These two courses have been co-developed to prepare you for future coursework in the math department that meet the foundations mathematics requirement for graduation. These two courses alone will not fulfill this requirement and cannot count toward the credit hours need to complete an undergraduate degree from the University of Arizona.

The remainder of your schedule will be built from up to 11 units of the following courses:

The number of units in any specific one of the areas listed above will be determined based upon your intended academic program and coursework that explores your interests. You will review your schedule and discuss your options with your academic advisor at orientation to make sure you are enrolled in appropriate classes for your first semester.

During orientation and throughout the summer you will have an opportunity to make adjustments to these units. Please remember that you cannot change your math course sequence without retesting or speaking with a math placement advisor. *Like math, English and second language course enrollment is based upon placement. If you have previous college credits (earned from dual enrollment, AP or IB tests or other college level programs) you must connect with a math, English or second language advisor during orientation to review your course placement.
