

Topics of Conservation Biology in Developing Countries

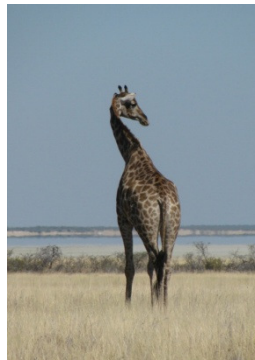

Course Topics:

Conservation of natural resources in developing countries can pose special challenges: demands for these resources are often great while the ability to control their use can be limited. This class investigates these challenges as they relate to plant and animal biology or behavior, microbes, water, soils, social issues of the local communities, etc. We will discuss broad scale research projects from peer-reviewed literature and the faculties' experience and how they can be adapted to student-led research projects.



Course Description:

This seminar class gives students interested in nature conservation in developing countries around the world the opportunity to identify focal areas and research topics that cater to their interests and degree programs. This class is also a good opportunity to develop an individual or collective research project for UA Study Abroad Summer Programs.
