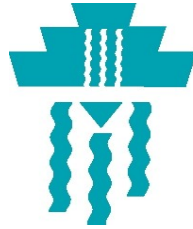

## **The 2013 Montgomery & Associates Summer Writing Internship at the WRRC**

The University of Arizona's Water Resources Research Center is offering a summer internship to a student interested in gaining experience writing about environmental and water issues. The internship is supported by Montgomery & Associates, an Arizona-based consulting firm specializing in hydrology and water resource issues. The selected intern will contribute to research and writing for an issue of *Arroyo*, the annual WRRC publication that focuses on a critical Arizona water issue. *Arroyo* is recognized as source of objective, accurate and understandable information and reaches a wide audience that includes policy makers and water professionals as well as the interested public.

The topic selected for the 2013 *Arroyo* is the value of water. It will look into prices of water, "virtual water" and non-monetary values, including the value of water in the environment.

Enrolled students in good standing at the University of Arizona, Arizona State University, and Northern Arizona University are eligible. The intern will work 20-25 hours per week during June and July, at a rate of \$10.00 to \$14.00 per hour depending on experience.

The intern will work at the WRRC offices in Tucson. The successful applicant will be responsible for his/her own accommodations.

Mark your calendar for Friday, **April 26, 2013**. This is a career fair for graduating students and alumni seeking permanent positions in the fields of Education and Nonprofits. Regarding Education, in addition to teachers, this can mean accountants, human resources and computer techs. The primary interviewing season for teachers is spring semester when school districts actively recruit. Educators interested in careers in education will have opportunities to interview with potential employers during this event in the Student Union Memorial Center

For students interested in a career in the nonprofit sector, this is a broad field with opportunities across the board. Oftentimes, working in nonprofits can offer opportunities for students and recent college graduates to stretch career-wise in ways that are not readily available in the more structured environments common to large corporations. The nonprofit sector includes organizations that work to fill gaps left by government and business sectors by directly or indirectly working with communities.

The nonprofit sector is comprised of organizations working towards a better world, as defined by each of these organizations' missions. Within the nonprofit sector, organizations have missions that directly contrast with one another — for example organizations on opposing sides of social or environmental issues. But the beauty of working within the nonprofit sector is that anyone can find a cause they believe in and work (actually get paid!) to represent the goals of that particular organization.

The Yuma County Ag Producers Scholarship is for students enrolling at Arizona Western College and/or the University of Arizona in Yuma for the 2013-2014 academic year, with an Agriculture or an Ag-related major. (Science and Engineering majors intending an Ag or Ag related career will be considered.) If a last year at UA in Tucson is necessary, it will be covered.)

**This unique scholarship will cover tuition at all three Yuma institutions, allowing participation in the 2+2 and 2+1+1 partnership programs, even if student is enrolled concurrently.**

**Eligibility Requirements:**

Eligibility requirements for this scholarship are:

GPA: High school cumulative GPA, as per transcript, must be 2.5 or greater. College transcripts will be considered, but focus is HS GPA.

Student must be a Declared Agricultural major or Ag-related major. Science and Engineering majors will be considered if there is a clear Ag focus or goal (as evidenced in educational plan or by other means.)

Student must be enrolled as a full-time student, as defined by the institution; a full time load distributed between institutions is acceptable as prescribed by the degree program.

Student must be enrolled in or intend to enroll in, or transfer to, a four year program through the UA. Students enrolled in a 2+2 or 2+1+1 program qualify.

Students must demonstrate a genuine interest in a career in Yuma agriculture, agribusiness, agriculture science, or agriculture engineering related occupation, preferably by having taken agriculture related courses and participating in agriculture related curricular and extra curricular activities.

Student must be in good standing.

**Recipient Information:**

- Recipients will be required to take courses of the degree program.
- Recipients will be required to have advisement with an Agriculture Advisor, only.
- Recipients will be required to file a four-year educational plan.
- Recipients will be required to have at least one (1) advisement session per semester.

# The Yuma County Ag Producers Scholarship

## Award Information:

Typical awards are from \$250 to \$1500 per academic semester and must be used for the academic year awarded. Unused or forfeited funds will be refunded to the YCAPS Fund.

Funding applies to Ag Technology & Management, Agribusiness, or Ag/Biosystems Engineering, Sustainable Plant Systems- Crop Production, Ag Business & Economics related degree programs, and prescribed courses for those programs, at AWC, and UA in Yuma or Tucson, only.

Recipients will be able to accept this scholarship, as well as any others received.

Funds will be paid directly to the institution(s) to be applied in the payment of the scholarship recipients' educational expenses, half of the award each semester, the second semester contingent on continued qualification of criteria.

YCAP scholarships apply to registration fees, tuition, lab fees, student equipment and related educational fees. Books and supplies from the AWC Bookstore or the UA bookstore are also covered.

Living Expenses: In appropriate circumstances, scholarships might also include funds for living expenses. Funding for living expenses will be decided on a case by case basis; awards for such will be distributed to the bursar's office for the distribution on a semester basis. No funds will be distributed directly to the student.

Funds will be applied to the following in the order of priority: Tuition, Fees, Books and supplies from the AWC or UA bookstore. (Residence Hall Fees, Food pass for the cafeteria in certain circumstances—please see Living Expenses, above.) No cash will be released to student.

- Funds will be administered by institutional scholarship and bursar's offices. Remainder funds will be returned to the YCAPS Fund.

Applications will be judged on merit, or financial need, or both.

Preference will be given to Yuma County High School graduates (includes San Pasqual).

Scholarship is renewable with re-application, compliance with scholarship agreement and continuation of criteria.

Four year programs for NAU at Flagstaff will not qualify for the YCAPS scholarship.

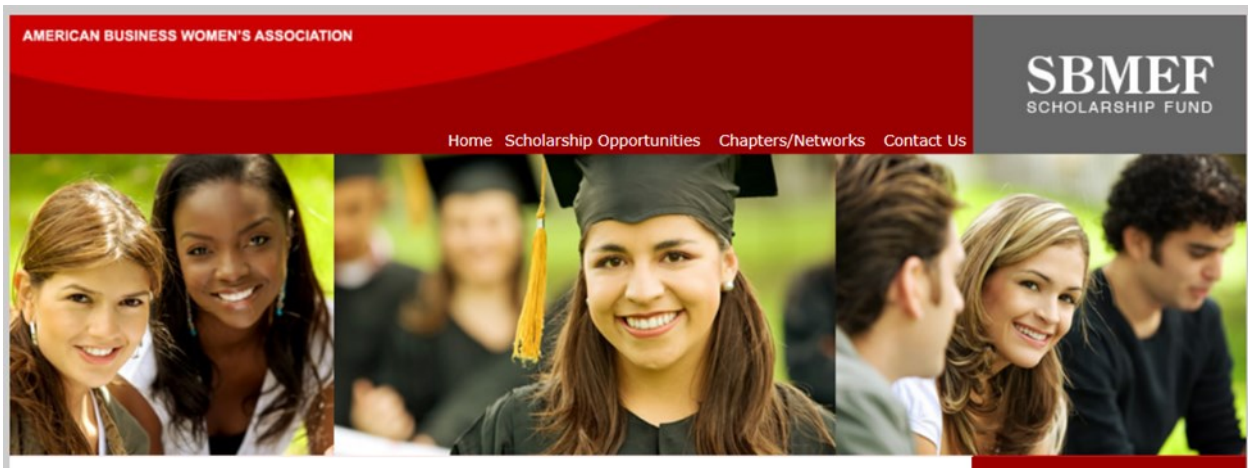
### ***The Curriculum***

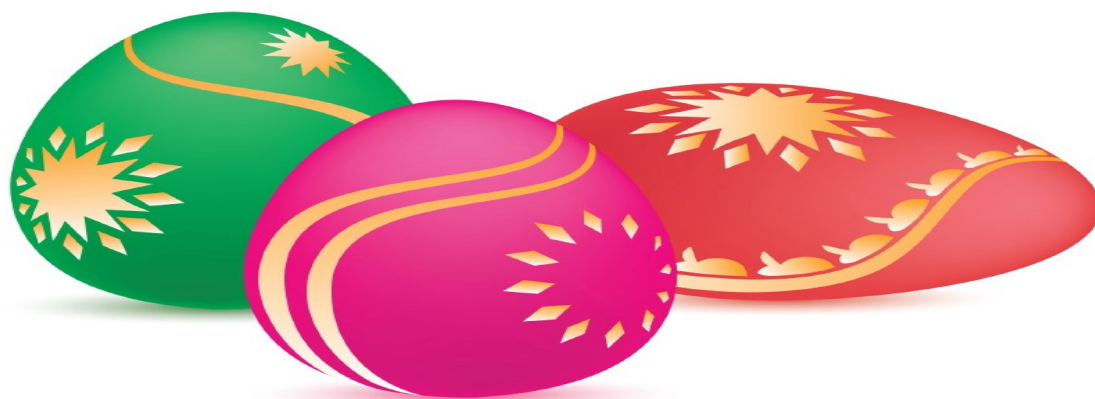
