Volunteers for Intercultural and Definitive Adventures (VIDA) is an international organization that provides free medical, dental, and veterinary services to needy communities in Costa Rica, Nicaragua, and Guatemala. The organization pairs pre-professional students with local professionals to provide these free services, as well as an amazing opportunity for the students.

Last summer, a group of over thirty students from the University of Arizona traveled to Costa Rica and Nicaragua for two weeks. There were both pre-medical and pre-veterinary students from the U of A, and three pre-dental students from the UK joined the team. For a total of seven clinic days, the team set up field clinics in a church, a school, a community center, and on private property. Many of the necessary materials were donations that the students brought with them, and the veterinarians, doctors, and dentists were all local professionals paid for by the students' trip fees.

The students received extensive hands-on experience in their field of study, from performing exams and assisting with diagnoses, to setting catheters and assisting with spay and neuter surgeries. In addition to learning practical skills in their fields, students got the opportunity to experience a different culture. Many of the volunteers had never been outside of the United States before, but they were able to spend a couple of days living with a Nicaraguan family, as well as interact with the locals who came to the clinics. Therefore, the experience was extremely beneficial in multiple ways.

This year, several students created an ASUA recognized VIDA club to provide fundraising and educational opportunities for the volunteers attending next summer's trip (although anyone is welcome!). The club will be visited by a variety of professionals to educate the members, from Spanish teachers to nurses and veterinarians. In addition to education, the VIDA club has been fundraising to purchase supplies and help students pay for their trip. 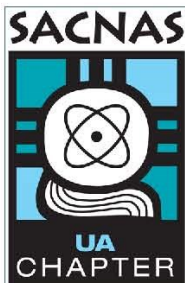

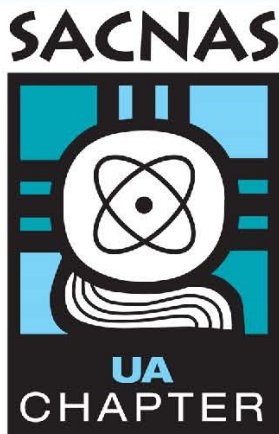

The goal of the **Ben Avery Scholarship** is to assist college sophomores, juniors and seniors in their pursuit of a degree in a natural resource-related field and assist them to gain practical knowledge regarding land stewardship. To achieve this, the Arizona Chapter of the SWCS and Peabody Energy offers the **Ben Avery Scholarship**. Together they will also provide scholarship recipients with assistance in obtaining hands-on experience through internships, volunteer programs and employment programs. In addition, the Soil and Water Conservation Society will assist university students in establishing collegiate chapters of the SWCS. The sponsors of the scholarship hope the recipients of the **Ben Avery Scholarship** will be employed and work to conserve the State of Arizona's natural resources.

**Ben Avery** was an avid promoter of conservation work until his death in 1996. He worked to encourage conservation among the public through his writings in the *Arizona Republic*. In addition, he worked to develop and implement conservation-minded legislation in the halls of the Capitol Building. Among his many achievements is the preserve at Aravaipa Canyon. He also participated in negotiations for the Central Arizona Project. Not only was Mr. Avery passionate about conservation work, but he knew the importance of higher education to ensure wise management of resources.

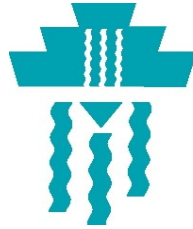

## **The 2013 Montgomery & Associates Summer Writing Internship at the WRRC**

The University of Arizona's Water Resources Research Center is offering a summer internship to a student interested in gaining experience writing about environmental and water issues. The internship is supported by Montgomery & Associates, an Arizona-based consulting firm specializing in hydrology and water resource issues. The selected intern will contribute to research and writing for an issue of *Arroyo*, the annual WRRC publication that focuses on a critical Arizona water issue. *Arroyo* is recognized as source of objective, accurate and understandable information and reaches a wide audience that includes policy makers and water professionals as well as the interested public.

The topic selected for the 2013 *Arroyo* is the value of water. It will look into prices of water, "virtual water" and non-monetary values, including the value of water in the environment.

Enrolled students in good standing at the University of Arizona, Arizona State University, and Northern Arizona University are eligible. The intern will work 20-25 hours per week during June and July, at a rate of \$10.00 to \$14.00 per hour depending on experience.

The intern will work at the WRRC offices in Tucson. The successful applicant will be responsible for his/her own accommodations.

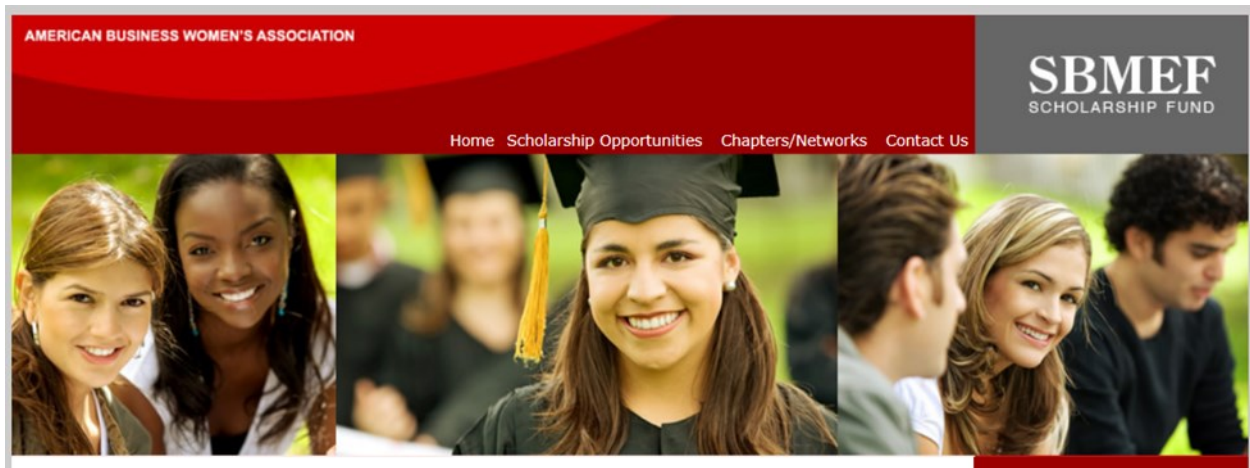

The amount awarded for each Outright Grant is \$1,500.00. Outright Grant scholarships are **non-renewable**. Applicants may receive only one Outright Grant each award year. The entire application process for the Outright Grant Scholarship must be completed by **May 1, 2013**.
