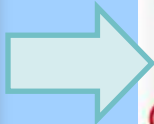

The All-Arizona Academic Team Award is a highly competitive undergraduate tuition scholarship offered to a select number of community college transfer students planning to attend one of the three state Universities. The Arizona Board of Regents selects students from nominations made by Arizona community colleges.

Students using the award at one of the other State Universities may transfer the award to the UA, but the student must be meeting the renewal criteria of the scholarship. See "Transferring the Scholarship" below.

LUS Eligibility

1. Verify your lawful presence as described under Arizona's Proposition 300.
2. The award must be claimed within one year of the offer.
3. Be enrolled in a minimum of 6 UA units each fall and spring semesters.

Renewal Criteria




1. Maintain at least a 3.25 cumulative UA grade point average each semester.
2. Complete at least 6 UA units per semester.
3. Consortiums, correspondence, audit, and units* from other institutions while attending The UA not count toward the 6 units per semester.

Multiple Awards and Tuition Programs

1. Students offered multiple awards designated for regular tuition cannot receive more than 100% of the cost of tuition from the combination of the awards. The regular tuition does not include differential tuition, fees, surcharges, room and board, books, or other expenses.
2. This award cannot be combined with the Transfer Academic Achievement Award, Phi Theta Kappa Award, or the Regent's High Honors Endorsement Award (AIMS).
3. This award will be reduced if the Qualified Tuition Reduction (QTR, a benefit for faculty and staff) or other tuition reduction programs are utilized.

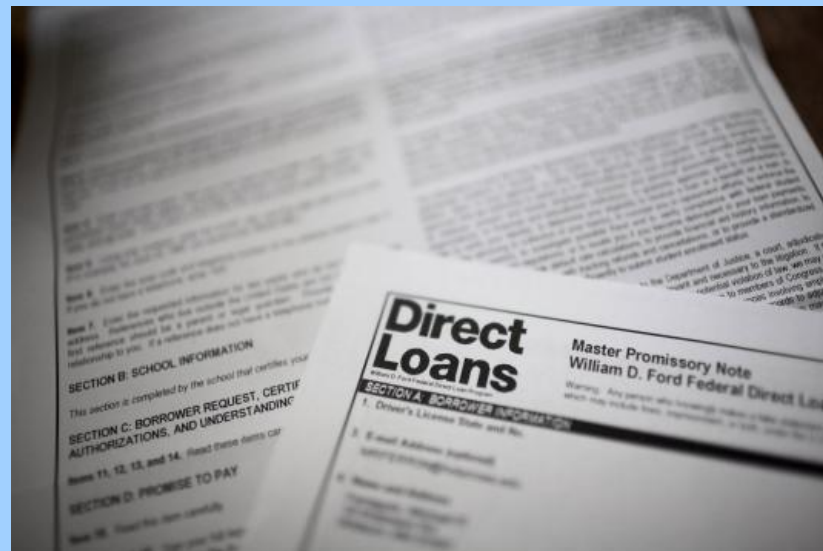

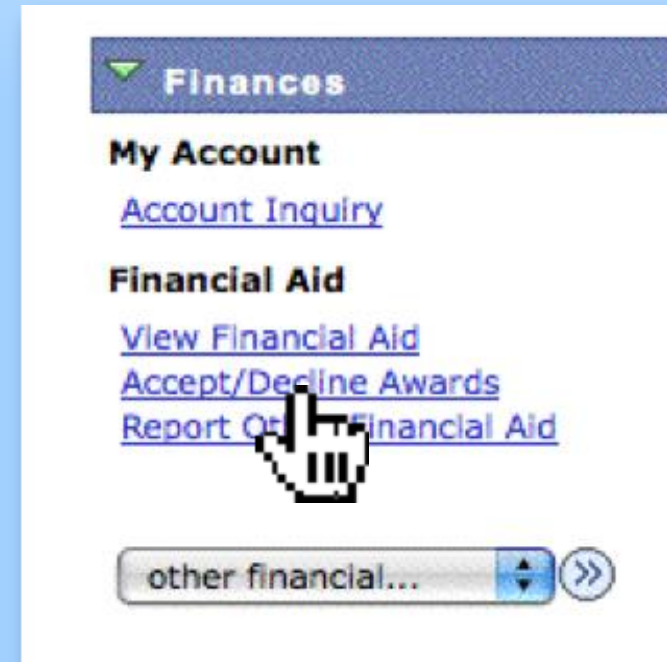

Parent PLUS Loans

- 🐾 Parent (not student) must take action.
- 🐾 Credit Check required.*
- 🐾 Can request loan be deferred while student is enrolled in school or you can begin repayment while student is in school.
- 🐾 Awarded up to student's Cost of Attendance.

Pace

You must meet Pace and progress toward graduation by successfully completing 2/3 of the cumulative units you attempted.

$$\text{Pace} = \frac{\text{Cumulative number of hours (credit hours) that you have successfully completed}}{\text{Cumulative number of hours (credit hours) that you have attempted}}$$

Attempted: Number of credits for which you received financial aid (less than or equal to 12 units).

Below are examples of how a student would meet or not meet the Pace SAP standard.

Student A has attempted 100 units throughout their UA career and has successfully completed 67 units. 67/100 units is above 2/3 of the cumulative units they have attempted. Therefore, Student A meets the SAP Pace standard.

Student B has attempted 100 units throughout their UA career and has successfully completed 60 units. 60/100 units is below 2/3 of the cumulative units they have attempted. Therefore, Student B does not meet the SAP Pace standard.

Example	Cumulative Units Completed	Cumulative Units Attempted	Completion Percentage	Meets SAP?
Student A	67	100	67%	Yes
Student B	60	100	60%	No

Important Note: Only enroll in the number of units you can complete!

The following courses do not count as attempted or completed units in the SAP calculation:

- Correspondence
- Audit
- Credit by exam

The following courses count as attempted but do not count as completed units in the SAP calculation:

- Incomplete*
- Failed
- Withdrawn
- More than one repeat of any previously passed course

Aid: Prior SAP Suspension

You are not meeting financial aid Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) standards in one or more of the following areas:

- You did not meet the Pace requirement.
- Your cumulative GPA is below the minimum requirement.
- Your cumulative units exceeded the maximum timeframe allowed for aid.

You have been placed in Financial Aid Suspension status and are ineligible to receive federal and institutional financial aid. You may appeal this suspension by submitting a SAP Appeal form. To review the SAP standards and access the SAP Appeal form, visit <https://financialaid.arizona.edu/managing-my-aid/satisfactory-academic-progress-sap-policy>. You must meet with your academic advisor for assistance with the Academic Plan and Academic Advisor Statement on pages three and four of the SAP Appeal form.

If you have been awarded aid, you should submit your SAP Appeal form as soon as possible, as no aid will release to your Bursar's Account unless your appeal is approved by a financial aid counselor.

If you have recently submitted a SAP Appeal form, monitor your UA email for updates regarding your appeal. You can also monitor your SAP status on UAccess Student Center under My Financial Aid Status.

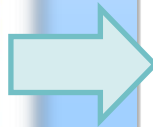

Appeal Guidelines

A student who is no longer eligible for federal or institutional financial aid due to a failure to meet the terms of their SAP Appeal Academic Plan and who has been placed in Financial Aid Suspension may appeal this status.

1. Does withdrawing from all classes affect financial aid?

2. Is there a point in the semester that a student has earned all of their aid?

If a student completes 60% of the term (a date will be noted for current semester on above website), there is no return of federal funds.

If their college has a different start and end date (Dynamic Classes), contact the financial aid office for the 60% date. If a student is enrolled in a summer class, or any dynamically dated class (module or 7 ½ week course), they should drop a (future) class they do not wish to attend prior to ending their current enrollment in a class.






3. If a student withdraws for medical reasons, will federal aid be returned?

A return to Title IV calculation will be performed. No federal exceptions for medical reasons. The University will provide a supplemental refund of tuition, if the medical documentation is approved through Campus Health.







Special Circumstance Examples:
