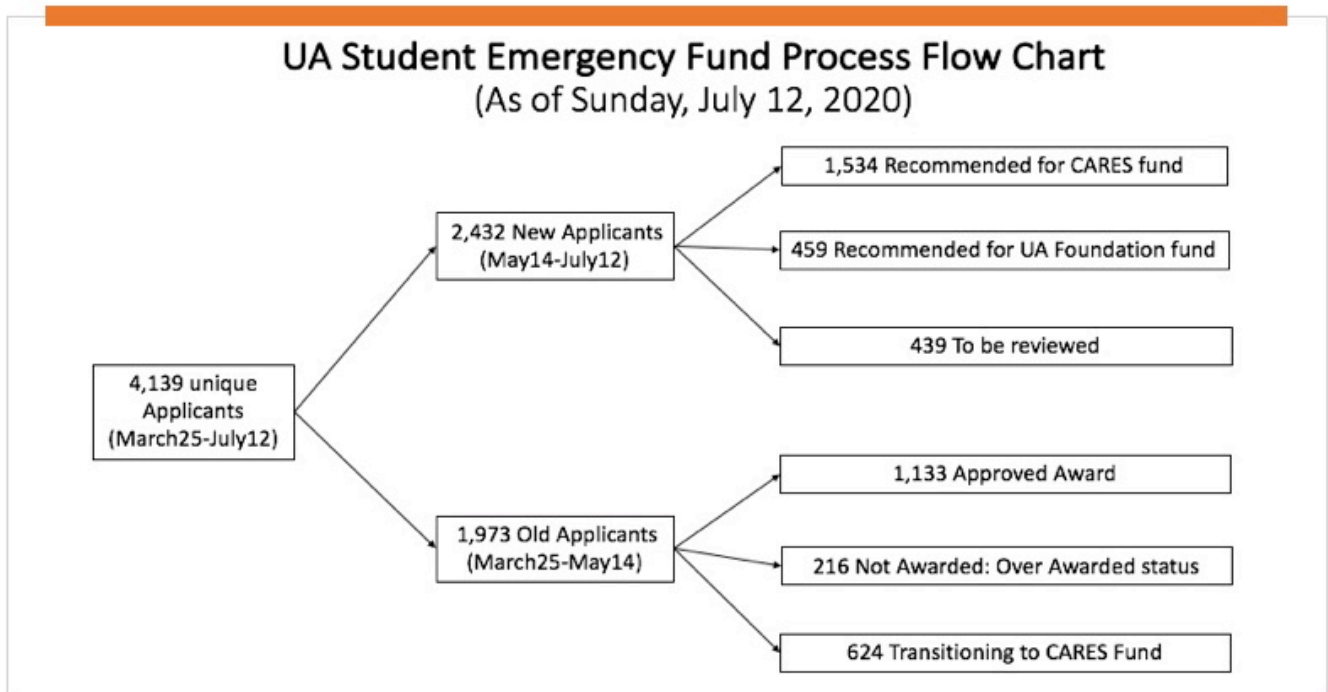


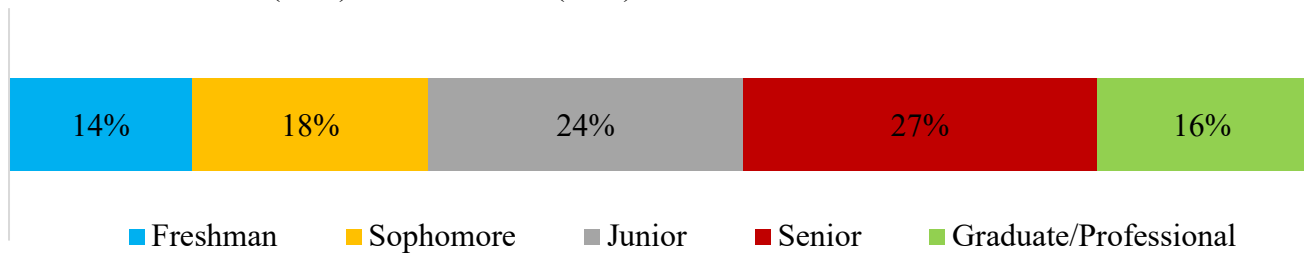
## UA Student Emergency Fund Report

The University of Arizona established the [Student Emergency Fund \(SEF\)](#) to support students impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. On March 25<sup>th</sup>, 2020, the SEF online application debuted on the Dean of Students Office web site, in addition to the successful *Fuel the Response* campaign where the community could support students in need. This report summarizes the portfolio of the SEF applicants (n=4,139) and funded students (n=3,068). Data represents applications over three months **March 25<sup>th</sup> – July 12<sup>th</sup>, 2020**.



### Funded Students (n=3,068) Profile

About 27% of the funded students are Senior, followed by Junior (24%), Sophomore (18%), Graduate/Professional (16%), and Freshman (14%).



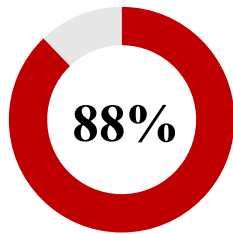

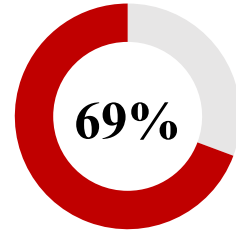

A majority (88%) of the funded students are full-time students.



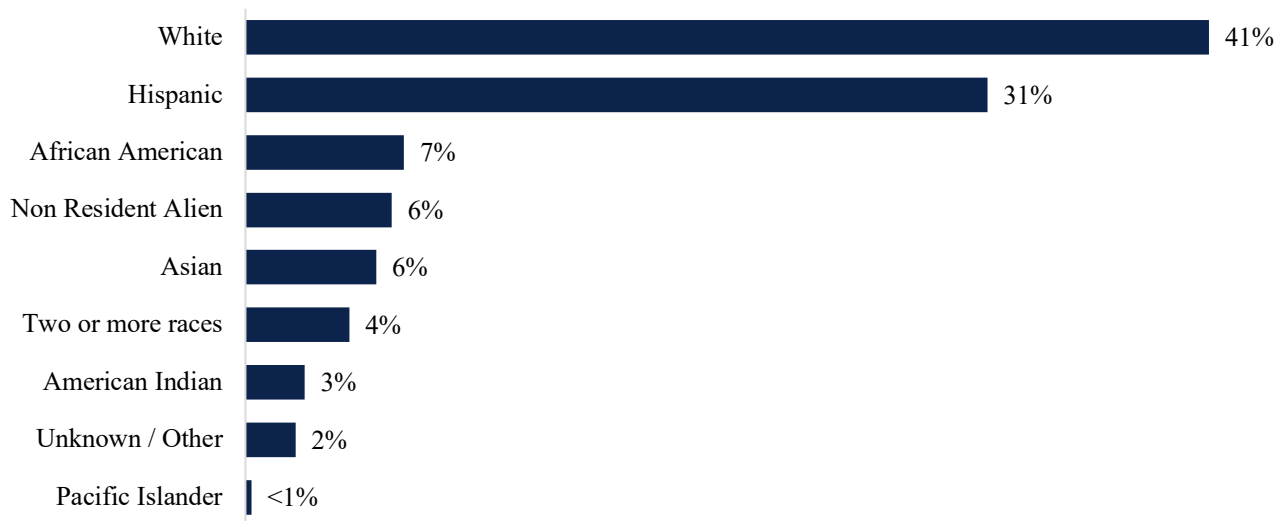
**Full-time**

About 69% of the funded students are Arizona residents.

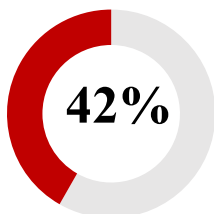


**AZ Resident**

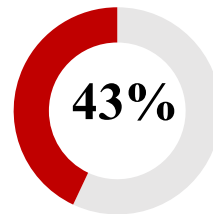


About 42% of the funded students are First-Generation students.



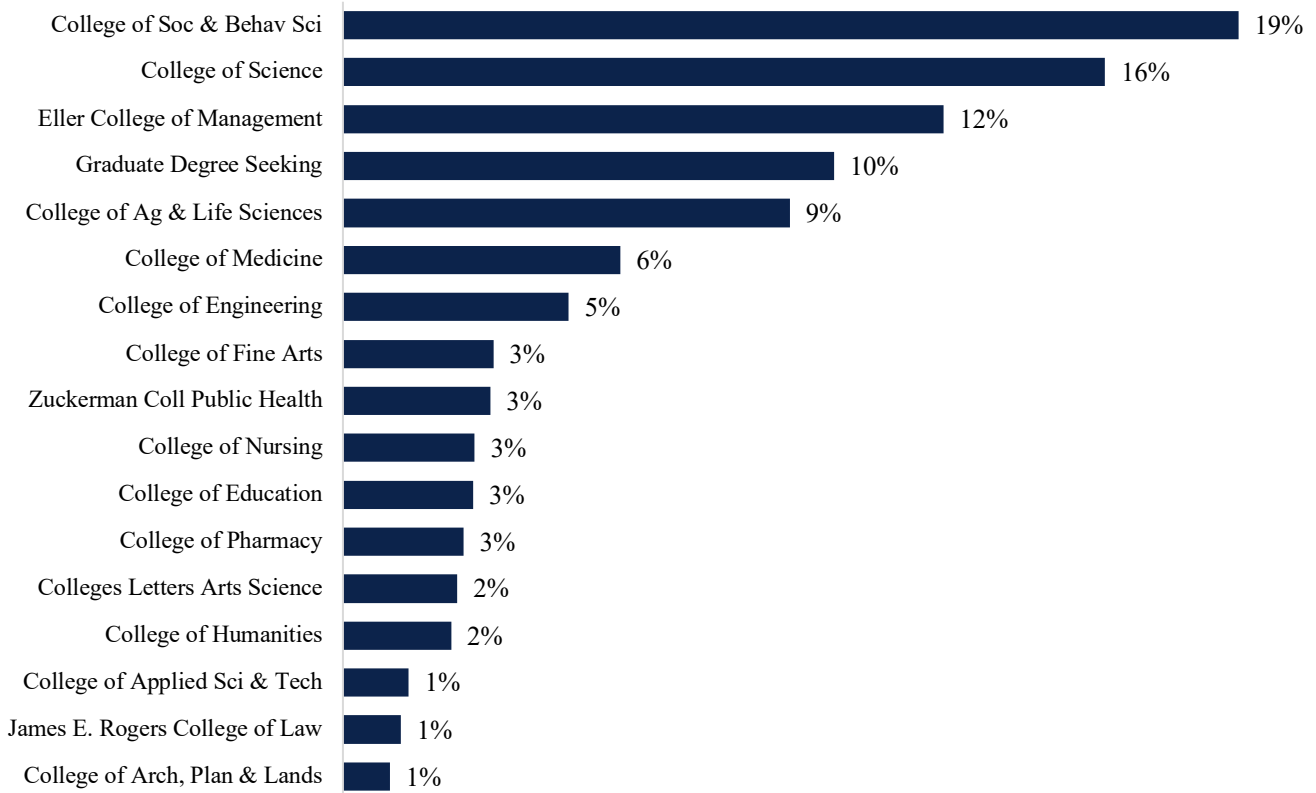
**First-Generation**

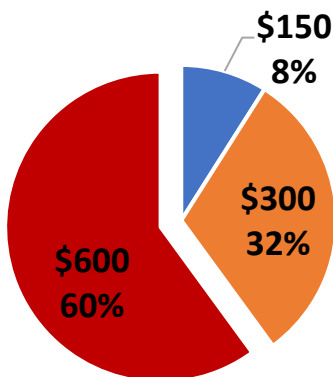


### Amount of Money Awarded

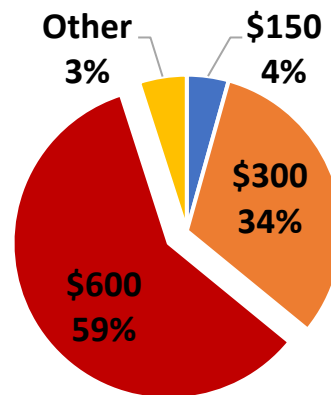
More than half of the recommended for funding students were awarded \$600, followed by \$300 and \$150.

*CARES Funding Breakdown*



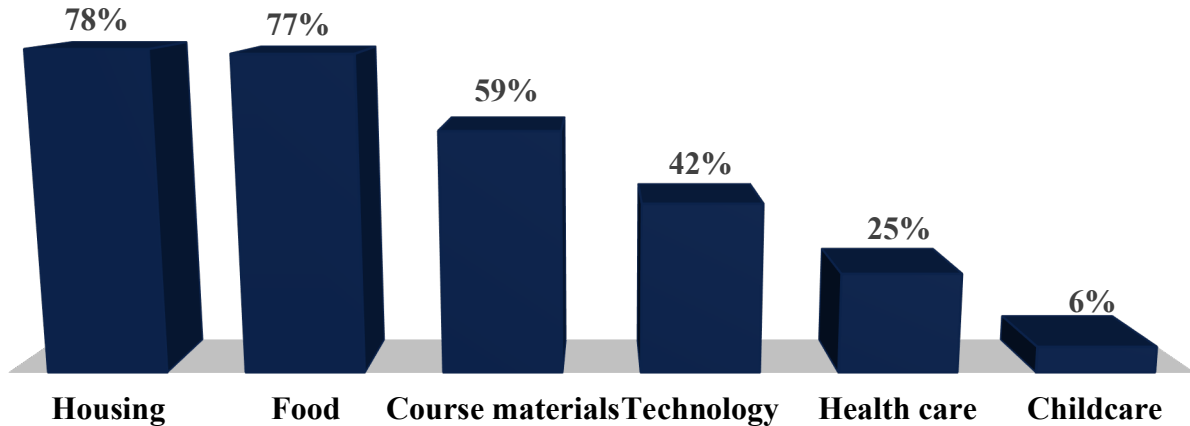
*Foundation Funding Breakdown*



## Needs to Apply for Funding

Among the funded students, when asked the expense that SEF would be used for, 78% of them stated that they need funding for housing, followed by food (77%), course materials (59%), technology (42%), health care (25%), and childcare (6%).
