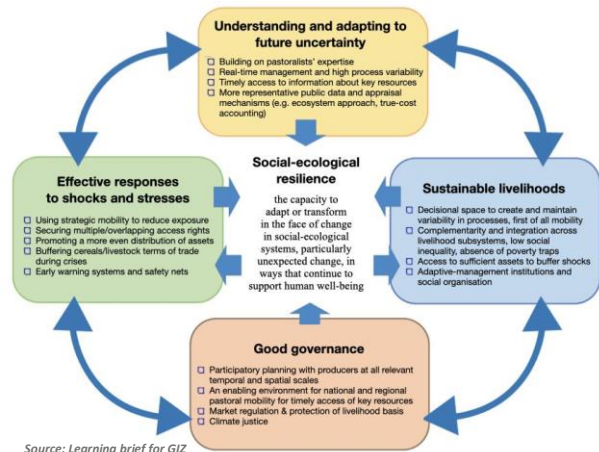


## INVITATION: PASTORALISM AND CLIMATE CHANGE
