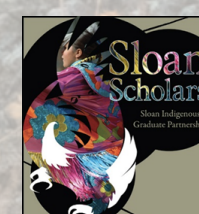
ABOUT THE SPEAKER:

Dr. Sello Villegas (Tohono O'odham) serves as the Director of Water Resources for the Tohono O'odham Nation. His leadership and passion have been instrumental in developing a climate change adaptation plan for the Nation, which was approved by the Legislative Council in 2018. Dr. Villegas grew up on the Tohono O'odham Nation with his grandparents and would later attend the University of Arizona where he received a Bachelor's and a Master's degree in Wildlife and Fisheries Science and a Ph.D. in Science with emphasis on Environmental Toxicology. After working with the US Fish and Wildlife Service as an Ecologist, he returned to the O'odham Nation to become the Ecologist/GIS Manager, then the Director of the Natural Resources Department before assuming his current directorship.
