Prior to joining QIAGEN, she was a Senior Scientist at Life Sciences, Motorola and a Senior Research Associate at the Oak Ridge National Laboratory. Dr. Kruchinin received her Ph.D. from the St. Petersburg State University in Russia and performed her postdoctoral work at the University of Tennessee. •

Previously, he completed a postdoctoral fellowship at Pfizer in which he actively led Pfizer's research efforts in a collaboration with Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis. Dr. Haim graduated from Albert Einstein College of Medicine in January 2007 with a Ph.D. in biomedical research. He has received several prestigious awards and honors including the NJ Governor's Award for Volunteerism in the Field of Health.
