

## **GRADUATION & BEYOND SEED GRANTS GUIDELINES - FALL 2023**

#### **ABOUT**

We invite you to submit an application for a Seed Grant. With the support of the Strada Education Foundation, the University of Arizona's Student Engagement and Career Development department has approximately \$50,000 available to be awarded to UA departments, colleges, and/or collaborative, cross-disciplinary teams to support initiatives that seek to improve equitable post-graduation outcomes for UA undergraduate students on Main, Distance, Sierra Vista, and Online campuses.

# We are seeking proposals that:

- > Focus on improving equitable outcomes for specific student populations served within unit(s), especially first-generation students, marginalized communities, and students of color.
- Use existing post-graduation and/or career-related data to develop potential initiatives. Some existing UA sources can be found on the <u>UA Assessment & Research</u> website, however, any external research (e.g. from <u>NACE</u>, <u>Strada</u>, or other organization) or unit collected sources are also encouraged.
- \rightarrow Include a willingness to test and iterate possible ideas that improve outcomes.
- May serve as a model for others at the UA wishing to undertake action to enhance equitable career outcomes.

With these funds, we hope to support approximately 6 to 10 projects. Funding must be dispersed by end of calendar year, 2024, however, project end dates may vary.

Proposals may include funding for student interventions, staff training, development of materials, events focused on key student populations, data collection support, employer/partner collaborations, among others. We encourage applications that are creative and flexible in serving the diverse post-graduation needs of UA undergraduate students. #### **ELIGIBILITY**

All full-time University Staff and Faculty are welcome to apply. Applications must be approved by the appropriate leadership of the applicant(s) department.

### **EVALUATION CRITERIA**

Requests will be prioritized based on the following criteria:

- 1) Evidence of data-informed solutions or initiatives (25%).
- 2) Detailed explanation for how project goals are expected to improve student outcomes, specifically for marginalized students (25%).
- 3) Plans for assessing short- and long-term outcomes (25%).
- 4) Project's potential ongoing impact beyond the grant period (25%).

## **SUBMISSION AND DEADLINE**

Applicants should submit all requests via Qualtrics no later than November 3, 2023 at 5:00 p.m. Arizona Time.

Please include how your project might create assets, resources, <u>or</u> build capacity in people or processes that could continue to influence students beyond the funding period.
