

Fall 2025 (FY26) and Beyond | Merit Aid Reduction Options

Background Information

- The models are conservative and built with limited application growth and significantly lower yield, due to:
 - Market influences and an increasingly competitive landscape. Many students are getting awards similar (or greater) to our current structure. Some institutions also include financial incentives around housing and/or meal plans.
 - Declining demographics.
 - o *Reputation* issues from current negative media coverage.
 - o *Out-of-State High School Counselors* are less likely to recommend application/enrollment to institutions with lower merit aid offers and increased cost of attendance.
- The models utilize the planned tuition increase for AY24-25 (3% for non-residents and 2.5% for residents). As tuition goes up for AY25-26, NTR will also increase.
- The models show a slight decrease in resident merit aid and large decreases for the top GPA bands for nonresidents.
- International merit aid is not yet included in the models. Changes will increase NTR.
- If test scores are incorporated, a larger review related to diversity of the class will be critical prior to final decision.
- All models result in lower academic quality, based on core GPA, and a smaller incoming class overall.
- Out-of-State High School Counselor Advisory Board members recommend Option One.
- The models project our best estimate/guess based on the information available at this time.
- Models can be altered.

Additional Options to Reduce Merit Aid Allocation

- Reduce or eliminate National Scholars Awards
 - \$2M/year estimated, if reduced or \$3-4M/year estimated, if eliminated
 - o Growth is expected in all categories.
 - Quick look at first-year retention for Fall 2022 Scholars:
 - National Merit Finalists = 95% (75)
 - National Merit African American Scholars = 90% (24) new in 2022 & growing
 - National Merit Hispanic Scholars = 97% (105)
 - National Merit Indigenous Scholars = 100% (1) new in 2022 & growing
 - National Merit Rural/Small Town Scholars = 95% (21) new in 2022 & growing
 - New for 2023: First Generation Scholars. Large numbers expected
- Reduce or eliminate IB "top up" Award
 - o \$750,000/year estimated, if eliminated
- Return to pre-pandemic merit aid renewal criteria
 - \$1-\$1.5M/year estimated
 - o Will impact retention
