Rules and conditions: Application deadline is May 6th, 2013. Applicant must be a current graduate student working toward an M.S. or Ph.D. degree in a seed-related area of study, including but not exclusive to plant breeding and seed physiology. Priority may be given to students that are more than one year, but less than two years from anticipated graduation with this degree. However students outside of this window are also invited to apply. Program funding is from private seed company donations, so the number of applicants accepted will be limited by available funds and not all applicants may be accepted. Selection of students is expected to be made approximately 2 weeks after the application deadline.

Evaluation factors may include, but are not limited to: academic performance, activities, personal performance and proficiencies; degree sought; connection of research area to the overall seed industry; future plans relative to the seed industry; and recommendations by major professor and others. Geographical diversity, seed species diversity, and study area diversity may be considered. Race, creed, color, sex, or nationality shall not be considered in selection criteria.
