

Natural Resources Workforce Development 2022-2023 Fellowship



Team Science Theme: Climate-informed management of natural resources in aquatic ecosystems to support effective climate adaptation

The Southwest Climate Adaptation Science Center (SWCASC) Natural Resources Workforce Development (NRWD) Fellowship was developed to provide graduate students with opportunities for training and practice in developing useinspired and actionable science to inform natural resource management decisions. Those selected will make up a team of 8 scientists, working together over the course of twelve months.

One applicant from each of the seven SW CASC consortium institutions (see map) will be selected. We encourage broad participation from students who identify with groups that have been traditionally underrepresented in the government and academic workforce. **There is funding for one additional award for an Indigenous scholar at The University of Arizona.**

Funding for successful applicants includes a stipend of **\$7,000**, with an additional travel allowance of **\$1,000** for each cohort meeting that occurs away from their home campus. The 2 successful University of Arizona applicants will be eligible to receive one full year of graduate tuition (*see note to right).

Applicants Must:

Be currently enrolled in a Master's or Ph.D. degree-granting program at one of the SW CASC consortium institutions (see map).

Be a student in good standing and progressing toward completion of their degree.

Be able to attend two inperson multi-day cohort meetings Fall 2022 and Fall 2023, and bimonthly cohort teleconferences.

Demonstrate the relevance of their research to the 2022-2023 SW CASC NRWD Team Science Theme.
