### Q: Who is eligible for this program?

**A:** To be eligible for this program, you must have some prior hands-on experience in agriculture, as well as:

- Hold a valid US Passport
- Be between the ages of 20-30 at the time of application
- Meet the Australian Department of Immigration's Work and Holiday Visa requirements.

### Q: How much does this program cost?

**A:** There is no set participation fee for this program, however you are responsible for your own living costs throughout your stay in Australia. We offer flexible travel packages for those who would like travel and visa assistance. Otherwise, you are free to make your own flight and visa arrangements.

### Q: When do job placements begin?

**A:** Job placements typically begin during peak agriculture seasons:

- Cotton/ summer crops: March-April (planting) / September-October (harvest)
- Wheat: March-April (planting) / September-December (harvest)
- Livestock and various other crops: year-round

### Q: Where would I be working?

**A:** Our client's farms are located across regional Australia, mainly in Queensland and Northern New South Wales. All of our placements are with reputable private and corporate companies whom we know well and trust.

### Q: How much will I earn?

**A:** Wages typically range from \$700 to \$1300 USD per week during peak season. Accommodation is provided by most employers.
