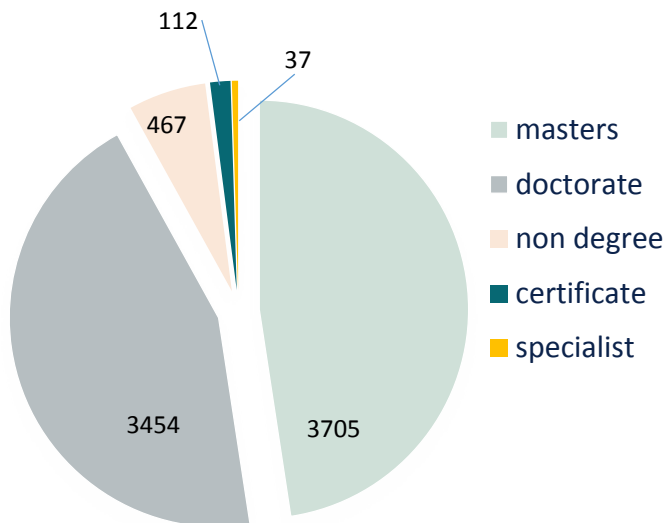

# FALL 2014 GRADUATE COLLEGE HIGHLIGHTS

UA is ranked **#1** in the number of PhDs awarded to Native American students.

UA is ranked **#9** in the number of PhDs awarded to Hispanic students.

At **19%** underrepresented minority,  
UA's graduate enrollment is the most diverse among all public AAU institutions.

**10** graduate programs are ranked in the **top 10**.

Graduate student enrollment represents **all 50** states and **over 100** countries.

The Graduate College administers **15** graduate interdisciplinary programs (GIDPs).

**2117** graduate degrees were awarded at UA in 2013-2014.

UA has the **#2** Peace Corps Coverdell Fellows program in the nation with **75** fellows in 2014-15.

The University Fellows program was launched this fall with **18** fellows representing **18** disciplines,  
providing a **\$30K** stipend, interdisciplinary training, and professional development.

The Undergraduate Research Opportunities Consortium (UROC) celebrates its **20<sup>th</sup>** anniversary this year.

The Latin America Summer Research Program has hosted **201** students and faculty from **4** Latin  
American countries since 2007 when the program began.

The UA Graduate College operates **5** distinctive resource centers on campus: Central Administration, Office  
of Diversity and Inclusion, Office of Fellowships and Community Engagement,  
Office of Latin American Initiatives, and the Graduate Center.

Nearly **700** faculty members from across colleges and  
disciplines participate in GIDPs.
