

# INVITATION: PARTICIPATORY RANGELANDS MANAGEMENT

A number of external and internal forces are putting pressure on rangeland resources often leading to over use and degradation and conflicts between rangeland users, including pastoralism. Specific ways to deal with these challenges have been developed over the years, including improved rangeland management interventions. In Ethiopia, Participatory Rangeland Management (PRM) has been adopted as an approach for improved rangeland management and to better secure rights to resources in pastoralist areas, improving not only technical inputs, but also strengthen governance and tenure security of rangelands. Since 2019, PRM is piloted in Kenya and Tanzania through an EU-funded project managed by RECONCILE, the CELEP focal point for Eastern Africa and in charge of coordinating the African component of the Rangelands Initiative of the International Land Coalition. Other partners involved in the project include Tanzania Natural Resource Forum, International Livestock Research Institute and CELEP, through its' European focal point at VSF-Belgium. The PRM process is now well ongoing in both Tanzania and Kenya and lessons can be drawn from its current application as well from its application in Ethiopia.

## **Overall objective**

The objective of this webinar is to share these experiences and draw lessons on the modalities under which PRM has been and continues to be applied in Kenya, Tanzania and Ethiopia to better understand how it could also be applied elsewhere.
