Subject: Recruiting a Feral Swine Coordinator/Assistant District Supervisor for Feral Swine Damage Management in Illinois

Date: February 3, 2014

The Illinois Wildlife Services program is recruiting a Wildlife Biologist to serve as a Feral Swine Coordinator to coordinate feral swine damage management in Illinois. The position is a full-time, term, GS 0486-7/9 not to exceed 13 months of employment. While Springfield, Illinois will be the duty station of this position, activities requiring official travel will be conducted throughout the state. Fringe benefits will be provided for this position. Relocation costs will not be paid for this position. The incumbent must begin work by March, 2014.

This assignment involves supervising of a team of WS employees conducting feral swine damage management in Illinois. The employee will also work closely with cooperating entities while conducting technical assistance and operational damage management activities. Work shifts change daily and will include working afternoons, evenings, and nights. Effective communication skills with other WS employees, partnering agencies/ entities, and the public are required, as is having demonstrated skills in conducting research on wildlife, technical writing, geographic information systems, and providing leadership to subordinates.

Candidates applying must meet the following criteria:

- Must be a U.S. Citizen, 18 years old or older; males born after 12/31/59 must show proof of registration with Selective Service System. (See website: <http://www.sss.gov>)
- Must hold a valid state driver's license at time of hiring.
- Must be able to legally possess and use firearms and obtain a State of Illinois FOID identification card within six months of employment.
- Must have a degree or completed course work in wildlife management or a related field, or have comparable experience.
- Must pass a drug test prior to employment and certify that they have never been convicted of a misdemeanor domestic violence crime (Lautenberg Amendment).

Interested individuals should send a resume, transcripts, DD-214 (Member 4 copy) and/or VA letter required for applicable Veteran preference, OF-306 Application (See website http://www.opm.gov/forms/pdf_fill/of0306.pdf), and contact information for three references.
