Prineville District will be filling two Rangeland Mgmt. Specialist Positions

- Rangeland Management Specialist, PERMANENT GS-454-07/09
- Rangeland Management Specialist, TERM GS-454-07/09
(Note: TERM is 13 month - 4 years with potential to be converted to perm. District will use the Recent Graduate Hiring Authority, which means applicants must have received a relevant degree within last 2 years)

Specialists provide basic input to interdisciplinary reports, stipulations for range ecosystems and environmental assessments. The positions require skills for gathering, analyzing, and interpreting resource data, and the ability to provide recommendations for improved allotment administration to management and input into decisions regarding the management of livestock grazing allotments.

Daily activities may include monitoring resource conditions, authorizing livestock use, processing permits, and executing unauthorized use actions, range use adjustments and exchange-of-use authorizations. In addition, the specialist may be responsible for documenting grazing impacts to sensitive grasslands, wild horse effects on riparian systems, or the impacts of recreation on grazing.

Prineville BLM is the largest District in Oregon with 1.65 million acres across 13 counties. The district is in the rain shadow of the Cascade Mountains and has a mild, relatively dry climate. High temperatures can exceed 100 degrees in the summer, while sub-zero temps are common in the winter.
