**Description:** A MS or PhD graduate assistantship is available starting in May 2016 or at the beginning of the Fall 2016 semester. The successful applicant will conduct research in cattle grazing distribution and foraging behavior. Our research team is developing protocols that ranchers can use to genetically select cattle for increased use of steep and rugged terrain and areas far from water. Applicants will be immersed in telemetry studies and spatial technologies. Our research team handles cattle on horseback frequently and interacts with ranchers regularly. Applicants with experience working cattle, riding horses and using GIS and Excel are preferred.
