

Non-tenure Track Assistant Professor Positions
Department of Environmental Science

The Department of Environmental Science at the University of San Francisco invites applications for two non-tenure track, full-time Assistant Professor positions to begin August 2016. The positions are for one academic year.

For the first position, the successful candidate will have expertise in using statistical and quantitative techniques to solve environmental problems and a strong interest in teaching foundational quantitative skills to undergraduates. The candidate's expertise shall include environmental or aquatic chemistry, environmental health and toxicology, environmental engineering, or other quantitative subdisciplines of environmental science. The candidate will be expected to teach a mix of undergraduate and graduate courses, including:

- introductory data analysis courses for undergraduates
- graduate courses in the candidate's area of specialty, preferably air or water quality or risk assessment and management

For the second position, the successful candidate will have expertise and a strong interest in teaching ecology and introductory environmental science courses to undergraduates. The candidate's expertise should be in ecology or a related discipline. The candidate will be expected to teach a mix of undergraduate and graduate courses, including:

- introductory environmental science for non-science or science majors
- undergraduate ecology
- upper-division or graduate courses in the candidate's area of specialty

A strong record of teaching at the university level, evidence of scholarship, an earned doctorate by August 2016, and an understanding of and commitment to support the mission of the University of San Francisco are required.

Applicants should submit a cover letter summarizing interests and qualifications (including research expertise), *curriculum vitae*, a statement of teaching philosophy and experience, evidence of teaching ability (e.g., sample syllabi, teaching evaluations).
